
The Road to Holy Consecration

What is Holy Consecration?

This special dedication is often called the "Holy Baptism and Chrismation" of the church. The Holy Altar Table and walls are anointed, cleansed, dedicated and sanctified in a similar way that we are when we are baptized.

In a tradition that dates back to the 4th century when Emperor Constantine the Great legalized Christianity, the holy relics of holy saints and martyrs are deposited and sealed in the Holy Altar Table for all time.

Consecration means to be sanctified, anointed, set apart and made fit and holy for God's sacred use: to be perfected and renewed.
